About the Course

Level two Indonesian prepares students to handle communicative tasks in various social situations such as making hotel reservations, bargaining at the market, negotiating simple preferences, starting, maintaining, and closing a conversation on familiar topics, reading and writing uncomplicated biographical account. Grammar and structure are taught and presented in real life contexts. As an important component of language learning, various aspects of Indonesian culture are integrated into the language instruction.

A range of language-learning activities is available both inside and outside classroom. *Indonesian will be the language of instruction. Questions or concerns that require the use of English are addressed outside of class.*

The course meets Monday through Friday from 08.00 am to 12:00 pm in 54 Bascom Hall. The students are also suggested to attend Indonesian conversation table on Fridays at 4-5 PM in the Terrace, Memorial Union. The language table is not compulsory.

- 4 engage to and participate fully in the classroom activities
- 3 present, but passive
- 2 present, but late and/or disturb the class
- 1 significantly late or disturb the class
- 0 elective absent

(b) Homework should be submitted on the next day to the teacher who assigns it. A three-day late submission will not be graded.

(c) A short weekly quiz is given every Monday except on June 18, 2012.

(d) There are 3 individual projects and 2 group projects. Please see the academic calendar for the outline and due dates.

(e) The summer program is divided into two sessions/semesters. Each session has oral and written final exams.
